As I understand it from Robert Logan, Chair of GA Parish Council, the primary school is heavily oversubscribed and there is no doctor's surgery in Great Ashby, making a nonsense of theser points raised as justifying the development. S106 payments proposed would hardly seem adequate and do not address these needs. Whether Alleyn's is moved is a moot point at this time and were it to happen would strengthen our arguments regarding increasing traffic volumes on church lane Jack

I haven't managed to go through all the documentation, but I would suggest building on the green belt traffic etc.

However as I believe that they are trying to push this through before the local plan process has been completed, I would suggest that a request to delay a response until after the August meeting, this will give more time to get a response on the green belt letters.

A letter could also be sent to Peter Lilley expressing concerns that as we understand it that this application will be heard before the Local Plan consultation process is complete and what action would be needed to ensure that this was prevented from happening particularly considering the latest Government statement on the green belt.

I hope this helps.

Well what can we add to the long list of objections/suggestions etc over the past years? I went up to Great Ashby last year to view the plans of the builders and spoke to several of their people at length.

For me it all circulates around the transport issues as the developers seems to have now managed to persuade the original land owners to sell.

Back Lane as they call it (Church Lane to us!) is just not able to cope with the extra traffic all the various phases will inevitably bring - thus issue has been raised so many times but as yet I have never seen any full survey or plan as to how this will be resolved. My feeling is that it will be brushed under the carpet and we will suffer for years to come. The traffic today is bad enough both in terms of volume and speed and just walking down the Lane can often mean diving for cover in the side hedges!

The style of housing I really cannot comment on except to wish they hadn't got to be built at all!
